

Telehealth dietetics must continue past March 2021 -Letter 2021

Sent February 2021 - Dietitians Australia wrote to Ministers and Shadow Ministers advocating for telehealth allied health services to be made permanent.

Letter excerpt

On 27 November last year, Minister for Health and Aged Care, the Hon Greg Hunt, advised Australians that telehealth would be made a permanent part of Medicare and be universally available for all Australians. This announcement was enthusiastically welcomed by dietitians and their patients across Australia, who because of telehealth were able to take control of their health during the pandemic. However, the lack of information about what conditions might apply to see a dietitian via telehealth is causing patients great concern.
