



COVID-19 and Dietetic Skills Recognition and Skills Migration Assessments

How is COVID-19 affecting the processing of applications for Dietetic Skills Recognition (DSR) and Skills Migration Assessment?

The Dietitians Association of Australia (DAA) is continuing to monitor the situation surrounding the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) and is guided by publicly available information from the [Australian Government Department of Health](#) and the [World Health Organisation](#) (WHO).

At this stage the Recognition services Unit of the DAA will continue to process applications in relation to Dietetic Skills Recognition (DSR) and Skills Migration Assessments, business as usual. Some examinations have been affected by the closure of exam centres, additional information can be found on the [DAA website examination page](#) in relation to these changes.
